A NOTE FROM PASTOR WENDOLYN



On a recent Saturday, our Church hosted a booth at the Good Old Days festival. Chris Dennis planned and set up, Corinne bought our activities and hand-outs, and Grace members gave an hour or two to share God's love with passers-by. It might not sound like much - we helped kids and youth to color a shell, and we invited adults to tie a prayer ribbon onto a display. And yet,

there were moments that were truly Grace-filled. As a Pastor, I got to hear ...

"Oh, you're the Church with the Food Pantry! and the Cookie Walk!"

"I've been wondering when I can bring my young kids to Church; but I know they can't sit still."

"Can I come to your Church if I don't know if I believe in God?"

"Can we come to your Church if we're gay?"

"Could you pray for my grandson? He just joined the military." (As tears began)

You know, these moments weren't miraculous - but they couldn't have happened anywhere other than that booth. None of those people were going to call the Church, or show up on their own. But because we were there and created a space for them to chat, we had over 1,000 contact minutes where we got to look people in the eye, and assure people that God - and we - love them just as they are. As a pastor, these were moments of grace: I got to tell a mom that it's ok for her daughter to miss Church once a month for Cheer, because she could share God's



love at that event. I got to tell kids that God loves the pet fish that they were coloring. I got to assure people that we would pray over their ribbons that had their hopes and fears.

Additionally, we got to invite these people to worship and to our upcoming benefit concert and Oktoberfest. I got to walk around to other booths and chat about how our Church can connect with what matters to them, and as I wandered, I noticed that we were the only Church there offering that simple, healing time with those hundreds of people. I was so grateful to be part of a congregation that said, as the mermaid Ariel sang, "[we] want to go where the people are"! Thank you for being a Church that welcomes all people, but doesn't wait for them to come find us. Mark your calendars and help us plan for future festivals, both in our Church home and out in our communities, so that we can bring Grace to those who need it!

CALL COMMITTEE (REPORTED BY STEPHEN GRING, CHAIR)

Bishop Tracey Bartholomew held a combined meeting with Council and the Call Committee on September 19. The Bishop presented a very comprehensive overview of the call process and reviewed the Ministerial Profile Document. Call Committee members were available to ask numerous questions about the process.

Bishop Bartholomew indicated that the process designed to find a suitable candidate could take a year or more depending upon the applicant pool. When final revisions to the MPD are received, the formal process will begin.

The Call Committee will meet in mid October to develop the interview process. In the meantime, the Bishop will begin to solicit applicants; upon determining a suitable match for Grace, the applicant's profile will be referred to the Call Committee for an initial review.

SUPPORT COMMITTEE-GIVING WITH GRACE

In the last episode we discussed the importance of having an up-to-date will. In this issue of Giving with Grace we will begin a discussion of the different types of property that can be given.

Cash:

A gift of cash is always a welcomed gift. Cash is that gift which keeps the door open and the heat on in the church. It is the simplest and most direct way to contribute to Grace. You may designate a gift to be used for a special purpose, or donate to the general good will of the community. Any unrestricted gift will find many uses.

The out-of-pocket cost of the gift of cash is less than the dollar amount given because of the charitable deduction that is created by the gift. *Example:* A person who pays 28 percent of their income in taxes, could make a gift of \$1,000 and the actual after-tax cost of that gift is only \$720. Recognizing that tax saving, could you afford to increase your weekly gift?

In the next issue, watch for a discussion of the double benefit of giving **Appreciated Securities or Other Appreciated Personal Property.** It is always good advice when considering any gift transaction to consult your tax advisor as to how that gifting strategy might affect your personal situation.
