INTRODUCTION: *Bible Focus for Advent and 2026!*

Each Sunday we are blessed to read, hear, and ponder a reading from one of the Gospels. For most of 2025, our readings were from the Gospel of Luke. Now, we turn to the Gospel according to Matthew. You'll be able to appreciate the readings and the sermon more if you have a sense of context - so throughout the year, Pastor will provide quick overviews that will help you connect more with God's Word for your life.

Matthew was written to early Christians who were mostly Jewish but in a Church that was increasingly of non-Jewish (Gentile) backgrounds. Jewish Christians were steeped in the promises given through Moses and the Exodus from slavery in Egypt. They would recognize when Jesus was quoting their Scripture (we Gentiles call it the "Old Testament" but it's very much active and alive). God's Law, like the 10 Commandments, is not discarded by Jesus - rather he is the fulfillment of the Law, the history, the prophets, and the promises that the Jewish Christians loved.

But both Jews and Gentiles were welcomed into the new promises given through Christ, and so Matthew's Gospel, written around 85 AD or 50 years after the crucifixion, was also a gift to teach new believers how to worship and live. From chapter 1:23 to the end of chapter 28:20 (Matthew's whole Gospel!), we will hear how **in every age** Jesus brings new vision and hope for us as we share in mission and as we grow ever deeper in relationship with Jesus, "God With Us," Emmanuel.

READING: Isaiah 11:1-10

Isaiah describes the coming of a future, ideal ruler who will renew David's royal line (the stump of Jesse). Gifted by the spirit of God, this ruler will reign with perfect justice. Enmity and danger will be restored to harmony and peaceful coexistence.

¹ A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.

² The spirit of the LORD shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.

³ His delight shall be in the fear of the LORD.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see or decide by what his ears hear,

⁴ but with righteousness he shall judge for the poor and decide with equity for the oppressed of the earth;

he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

⁵ Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist and faithfulness the belt around his loins.

⁶ The wolf shall live with the lamb; the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the lion will feed together, and a little child shall lead them.

⁷ The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

⁸ The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den.

⁹ They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain,

for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea.

¹⁰ On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.

GOSPEL: Matthew 3:1-12

Just before Jesus begins his public ministry, John the Baptist appears, calling people to mend their ways and speaking of a powerful one who is to come.

"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.'

¹ In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, ² "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." ³ This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

⁴ Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵ Then Jerusalem and all

Judea and all the region around the Jordan were going out to him, ⁶ and they

were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins.

⁷ But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? ⁸ Therefore, bear fruit worthy of repentance, ⁹ and do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor,' for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. ¹⁰ Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

¹¹ "I baptize you with water for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is more powerful than I, and I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹² His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into

the granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."
