The Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols, first held on Christmas Eve 1918, was conceived by Eric Milner-White. At 34, he had just been appointed Dean of King's College, an appointment influenced by his experience as an army chaplain which led him to believe the Church of England required more imaginative worship.

The service offers a flexible format for presenting the Christmas Story through word and music.
