

## CALL TO WORSHIP (adapted from Psalm 13:3-6)

## PRAYER OF LAMENT (adapted from Psalms 13, 47, 49)

Do not remember the sins of our ancestors, may your compassion come quickly to meet us where we are, for we find ourselves very low. God of our salvation, help us for the glory of your name, deliver us, and forgive us, for your name's sake especially at times when the world asks, "Where is their God?"

Our earthly world can seem dark and we can feel alone sometimes. We long for help. Sometimes we seek solutions which hurt us even more. Hear our cries, God of mercy.

How long O Lord, how long will you hide your face from me?

Have you forgotten me Lord? How long must I manage to just survive when my mind suffers every day? How long will my enemies rise against me?

Life can seem unmanageable at times. Sometimes things fall apart and we are hurt and confused. We question many things. We look to you, God, for guidance. See our situation and hear us, God of hope.

Arise, God, and plead my cause, that the poor and those in need may rejoice. Do not forget the cry of your foes rebelling against you.

We are tempted to trust only in ourselves and what we have known. We are often angry and afraid. We call on you and we plead that you hear our prayers. For you are the one who created us.

### **ASSURANCE** (adapted from Psalm 46)

We stand fearless at the edge of doom, and courageous in sea storms and earthquakes,

#### **GOSPEL READING - LUKE 2:8-20**

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them,

"Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger."

And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

#### **PRAYERS**

Let us pause to pray for the world, our nation, our community, and for one another in this holiday season.

God who is with is, in this season of anticipating the holidays and the new year, we sometimes find ourselves uncomfortable, uneasy, worried, sad, and feeling other emotions too. There are times we feel disconnected, unsettled, and different. Be with us as we face these feelings, calm our spirits and comfort our souls, that we may claim your promises to always be by our side.

Brief silence Let us pray to God, O come, O come, Emmanuel.

God of light and life, we come to you bringing concern for all those who struggle with alcohol and substance addiction, gambling addiction, food addiction, self-harm, pornography, cancer, disease, COVID-19, chronic illness, depression, anxiety, suicide, job loss, financial concerns, extreme debt, and any other physical, mental, and spiritual illness. We pray that your light will illumine their lives and break the chains of their temptations.

Brief silence Let us pray to God, O come, O come, Emmanuel.

God of peace and comfort, we pray for all who are victims of violence in its many forms. We pray for those experiencing the consequences of war, famine, disease, and natural disasters. Protect all those who are far from home serving their country or serving in support to those in need. Give encouragement to all those who are looking for help, looking for hope, and those who are healing physically, mentally, and spiritually. Grant that we may trust that you are in the midst of all who need your touch, that your healing presence will be seen and felt through your

Holy Spirit, and through all those working to alleviate suffering.

Brief silence Let us pray to God, O come, O come, Emmanuel.

God of love, we ask for your presence with all who are dealing with broken relationships with family, friends, spouses, and children. Remind us that you wish for us to be in uplifting and loving relationships. Lead us to repair the relationships which are life-giving. Lead us to forgiveness for others and for ourselves in relationships where we have been hurt or where we have hurt others. Be with us as we prayerfully examine other relationships which are harmful or difficult for us.

Brief silence Let us pray to God, O come, O come, Emmanuel.

God of new life, send your spirit to all who grieve many kinds of losses- loss of family, loss of friends, loss of dreams and opportunities. Jesus experienced the death of friends and the pain of suffering. You know and understand our pain and our deepest needs. Let your light remind us we are not alone, and grant us grace so that we may find hope in our sorrow, comfort in your peace beyond our understanding, and in times of death, resurrection.

Brief silence Let us pray to God, O come, O come, Emmanuel.

We come to you this night, O God, also in prayer for all those who are estranged from you. Be with all people who are overwhelmed by this world, all who are overcome by doubts of your goodness and love, and all who long for your presence in their lives. We pray for them and for times when we feel far away from you or in times when we doubt your mercy, forgiveness, grace, and love. Encourage us and empower us that we may hear your voice and feel your Spirit as you lead us home to you.

Brief silence Let us pray to God, O come, O come, Emmanuel.

#### LITURGY OF REMEMBERING AT THE ADVENT WREATH

The first candle we light is to remember those whom we have loved and lost. We pause to remember their name, their face, their voice, and the memory we hold of them. May God's eternal love continue to surround them.

The second candle we light is to redeem the pain of the loss, this loss of someone very important to us, part of our lives, part of our own selves. We pause to gather this pain and offer it to God, asking that God grant us peace. Refresh us, restore us, and renew us, O God. Lead us into the future path of our own journey.

The third candle we light is to honor ourselves this holiday season. We pause and we remember all of the stress, disbelief, times of feeling down, anger, sadness, times of feeling alone. We also think of all the affection and support we have received and we give thanks for the people in our lives who have helped us. The love of God, the light of Christ, and the peace of the Holy Spirit defeats death, darkness, and all the things of this world.

The fourth candle is lit to remember our faith and God's gift of hope that the Christmas story offers to us. We remember God's promises to us that one day there will be no more pain and no more suffering. Let us remember Christ, the One who shows us the way, brings us the truth, and who bears the light.

God beckons us as we wait for a future that is yet unknown.

## TIME FOR HEALING AND ANOINTING

During this time for healing and anointing, you are all invited to come forward as you are able for brief prayer with Pastor Althea and anointing with oil. Pastor will be using disposable cotton q-tips for anointing. Do not feel rushed. Please let an usher know if you would like prayer where you are seated. Pastor will come to you.

## **PRAYER OF BLESSING** (adapted from Psalm 73)

When my mind is unsettled, when I feel deeply sad, angry, dressed, or foolish without understanding

I will remember that you, God, are near even when I feel far away. I will remember that you are my refuge and my strength.

When I feel alone, upset, or misunderstood

I will remember that you, God, are always with me. You are with me in the quiet of night and the light of day. You are holding my hand and guiding me with your counsel. You are leading me toward your glory.

When I question who is on my side, when I feel lonely, when I feel exhausted, or outcast

I will remember that you, God, are by my side. I will be still and remember the peace you bring to my heart and mind beyond all understanding.

When we don't always have the words to pray, be near us, and hear the unspoken prayers of our hearts. We also remember that we can pray as you taught us:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.
